# Checklist for reporting suspicious behaviour

#### NOTE THE BASICS:

- Who did you see?
- What did you see?
- Where did you see it?
- When did you see it?
- Why was it suspicious?

### LOOK FOR PERSONAL CHARACTERISTICS:

- sex
- age
- race
- height
- weight
- build
- hair
- complexion
- accent
- other features e.g. tattoos, scars
- clothing
- weapons
- method of transport.

## LOOK FOR VEHICLE CHARACTERISTICS:

- numberplate
- colour
- make and model
- body type
- passengers
- damage or other unusual markings.

# WHEN IDENTIFYING SUSPICIOUS PACKAGES/OBJECTS, NOTE:

- colour, smell, shape
- wrapping and labelling
- postage, origin and return address
- spelling on any labels
- weight
- noises
- securing material e.g. tape, string
- protruding wires or tinfoil.

### **RECEIVING TELEPHONE THREATS:**

- 1. Stay calm.
- 2. Don't panic or make return threats.
- 3. Write down as much detail as you can.
- 4. Listen carefully for any clues about the caller.
- 5. Ask the caller for more information about the threat.
- Try to keep the caller talking for as long as possible.
- Try and get a co-worker to call police without alerting the caller.
- Once the call is finished, DON'T hang up the phone.
- Ensure you've written down as much as possible.
- 10. Tell your supervisor and report the threat to police immediately – don't use the same phone if possible.
